### 2024 Annual Scholarship Application

The mission of the National Association of University Women, Inc. NAUW desires to stimulate young women to attain professional excellence, to exert influence in various movements for the civic good, and to promote a close personal and intellectual fellowship among professional women. Education is a major focus of NAUW College Alumnae Club.

### SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The College Alumnae Club of the NAUW is accepting applications from female African American/Black high school college bound seniors who wish to apply for our \$1,000 scholarship. **The deadline to apply is May 10, 2024 at 5 p.m. EDT.** Scholarship awardees will be notified by June 14, 2024. The scholarship funds will be disbursed to the students' college, university, or higher education institute account.

### GUIDELINES/CRITERIA

#### The applicant must:

- Be African American/Black female.
- Be a resident of the following jurisdictions in the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan area: Washington, DC; Prince George's County, MD; Montgomery County, MD; City of Alexandria, VA; or Arlington County, VA
- Attend an accredited public high school in the following jurisdictions in the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan area: Washington, DC; Prince George's County, MD; Montgomery County, MD; City of Alexandria, VA; or Arlington County, VA
- Be in good academic standing with a minimum 2.5 GPA (i.e., 77-79% or C+).
- Be a High School Senior accepted at an accredited 4-year or accredited 2-year academic institution of higher education in a program leading to an academic degree, diploma, or certificate of higher study.
- Have good leadership skills as evidenced by a strong community service record.
- Have participated in extracurricular activities.

#### APPLICATION CHECKLIST – Your application will be considered complete upon receipt of the following items:

- A completed and signed application
- A copy of ACT or SAT scores unless waived
- An official high school transcript
- A copy of your college/university acceptance letter
- A copy of your decision letter/note indicating your college/university choice
- A personal essay (not to exceed 500 words, double spaced, size 12 Times New Roman font) addressing the following questions:
  - What are your career goals/aspirations?
  - Which community service activity has affected you more personally and why?
  - How will community service be integrated into your future career goals?
- Two reference letters
  - One letter must be from an educational professional (such as a teacher or counselor).
  - The other letter may be from another source (such as a coach or mentor).
  - References should not be relatives.
  - Refer to the Reference Guidelines Form in the application packet on page 5.

2. How would you describe the character of the applicant?
3. Describe the applicant's participation in school and/or community service activities and how she made a positive contribution to the school and/or community.
4. Describe how applicant is a positive role model for her peers and/or younger students.
5. Describe applicant's capacity for academic success in post-secondary education.
